Do One (1) of the Following

- 1. Show that the vector spaces M_{mn} and M_{nm} are isomorphic by finding a function $T: M_{mn} \to M_{nm}$ and proving that T is:
 - (a) a linear transformation
 - (b) injective
 - (c) surjective
- 2. Let $V = F(\mathbf{C}, \mathbf{C})$ be the vector space of all functions $f : \mathbf{C} \to \mathbf{C}$ that have domain and codomain the set of real numbers. [You do not have to prove that V is a vector space but you should recall the definitions of addition, scalar multiplication and equality of functions.] Define a function $T : V \to V$ by $T(f) = f_1$ where $f_1(t) = f(t-1)$. Geometrically, this function has the effect of shifting the graph of f one unit in the positive x direction.

Prove that T is an isomorphism.
